College Provides Ample Living Arrangements For Summer Session Students

Modern Dormitories And Dining Commons Provide Lodging And Meals; Men's Quadrangle And Atherton Hall Included; Reasonable Cost, Maximum Enjoyment

With its modern dormitories and dining commons providing lodging and meals at reasonable rates, the College amply meets the requirements essential to study and proper enjoyment of Summer Session activities
Frances Atherton Hall provides facilities for 503 women students, and the men's quadrangle, consisting of Watts, Irvin, and Jordan Halls, provides quarters for 278 students Irvin Hall, with a capacity of 70, will be reserved for students in music Women students taking courses in the Pennsylvania Workshop will be housed in the Woman's Building, with rooms for 76, and 103 men and women students in the French Institute will reside in Grange Dormitory

The business administration of the living accommodation on the campus, as well as assignments of rooms in Irvin, Watts, and Jordan Halls, is assumed by the Director of Dormitories The office of the Dean of Women supervises the assignment of rooms in women's dormitories and in cottages for married couples
The cost, per person, of a furnished double room in the College dormitories for the Main Summer Session is \$17 \$19, or \$21, single rooms \$24 or \$22 Price per person for married couples in the cottages is \$19 During the Inter and Post-Sessions single rooms may be obtained for \$4 per week, and double rooms at a cost of \$2.85, \$3.20, or \$3.50 per week A room reservation of \$5 is required for dormitory rooms during the Main Session
Meals for Main Session students will be served in the dining commons in McAllister Hall, seating 400 Women in Frances Atherton Hall will be accommodated in the dining room of that dormitory The cost for the session is \$40, or \$7 per week.

With a program designed to provide activity of a varied nature for both men and women, it is interesting to note that every student, regardless of age, sex, or size, was given an opportunity to engage in one form of recreation or another
Gaming Renown
Rapidly becoming known for its meaningful courses in health education because of an attempt to include in such courses the findings of recent experimental and clinical studies from the fields of medicine, nutrition, physiological chemistry, psychology, and biology, the School of Physical Education and Athletics is to be greatly praised for its achievements in extending the summer facilities
Under last year's plan, students could compete, get instruction, or just play for the fun, either alone or in groups The program for this year is patterned after that of last year and will furnish the same opportunities
943 Participated
Statistics on the recreation program show that 630 women and 313 men, a grand total of 943, were eager for the chance to participate in the various activities offered
Amazing in its broad scope, it is yet more amazing that practically the entire program for the summer can be enjoyed free of charge Nominal fees must, of a necessity, be levied for occasional features

Phys Ed Teachers Advised To Play

Summer Teaching Course To Stress New Methods

The School of Physical Education and Athletics sponsors the philosophy and practices the principle that teachers interested in professional growth need to recreate, relax, play, and enjoy life quite as much or even more than teachers who are at a professional stand-still Coupled with this is another principle, "practice what you preach," which is also obvious in the professional courses in recreation, athletic coaching, health education and physical education
Courses at The Pennsylvania State College in each of these four fields provide the teacher with up-to-the-minute materials, programs, methods, and points of view The recreational approach rather than the academic textbook approach is used in courses in recreational leadership and in the administration of programs of recreation
All coaching courses offered this summer count toward advanced degrees and are designed for the experienced coach Opportunities are offered for experimentation in analysis of the skills, methods, strategy, and plays in different sports Students are informed of experimentation in sports that has been conducted here at the College
Study Health Education
The same type of scientific approach is used in the study of health education Students discover the most recent clinical and experimental researches from such fields as psychology, medicine, nutrition, physiology, biology and chemistry and are aided in applying these knowledges to vitalizing health education The student is encouraged to adopt a critical approach as he studies the newer ways of unifying scientific facts and the interests and nature of the child

Alcatraz Fan Mail Reaches Klassen

Sociology Instructor Receives Many Thanks

Fan-mail from unexpected admirers in Alcatraz and other penal institutions is being received by Peter P Klassen, instructor in sociology, as a result of his recent recommendations for prison reform which attracted wide publicity
A letter written from the island fortress in San Francisco Bay and signed only by a prison number declared "I have read with much interest an article in our newspaper about your views of probation and parole I am much interested in this subject, being interested in penology and a student of applied subjects in my spare time"
An inmate of Jackson State Prison, in Michigan, writes the following "Your treatment is one of the healthiest statements ever uttered Thanks to you"
Klassen recommended that all offenders be examined and then placed in the type of prison environment best suited to their traits

Penn State Operates Own Shortwave Station

W8YA*And WLMA Are Call Letters Of College 'Ham' And Army Radio Established Here In 1908

CQ CQ de W8YA W8YA This strange signal flashes nightly all over the world from a small gray building in back of the University Club It is Penn State's own radio station
Back in 1908, almost 35 years ago, a young instructor set up a small amount of equipment and an antenna on the roof of the old wooden Engineering F building and began to broadcast by telegraph It was this young man, late to become Lieutenant Colonel Slaughter of the U S Signal Corps, who constructed one of the first radio stations in this country
In 1910 the Pennsylvania Railroad became interested in the station as a possible emergency signal system in case their own broke down The company provided the station with sufficient funds to purchase better equipment and also aided in the construction of a steel tower which has since been torn down The Class of 1912 donated their entire treasury to the College to pay for the tower
WFSC finally came into being as a regular broadcast station in 1920 Football games, Sunday morning chapel, student musical organizations, and all Commencement exercises were among the programs broadcast to the public
Federal Radio Communications regulations became so stringent that homemade equipment would no longer suffice and lack of the necessary funds to purchase new apparatus forced the College to close the station and surrender its license, returning to its old function as an experimental station
Since that time W8YA, its present call letters, has become increasingly active in experimental work and is now regarded as one of the foremost shortwave stations in the East It also serves as alternate for the official Army station in Washington and uses the call letters WLMA when acting in that capacity

Machine Smokes Tobacco, Pipes Like Human Being

Graduate, Instructor Construct Apparatus For Scientific Research

Does a certain pack of cigarettes really give you "5 extra puffs?" With the aid of their "smoking machine" Jason E Mathews, Jr and Dr Dennis E Haley of the department of agricultural bio-chemistry can answer this and many other questions about popular brands
Costing about \$750 to build, the machine is uncanny in its accuracy in smoking tobaccos The operator can control the length, the time, and the volume of each puff The smoke from the tobacco is trapped and every ingredient in it can be extracted and measured
The machine conceived by Dr Haley and Mathews is the only one of its kind in the world Construction was begun about the first of December and was completed the first of March
Its builder, Mathews, says, "The only thing our machine won't do is chew tobacco or develop a smoker's cough It will smoke cigarettes, cigars and even pipes
An elaborate system of temperature control will soon be installed so that the temperature may be determined at the very time the tobacco is being smoked
