### "NO EXCUSE FOR NEGLECTING RELIGION AT SUMMER SCHOOL" SAYS DEAN TRABUE IN LETTER

To the Editors  
Students in the Summer Sessions of The Pennsylvania State College have no excuse for neglect of their spiritual and religious development. Vesper services will be held in the Schwab Auditorium each Sunday evening at 7 30 o'clock. Each of these services will be addressed by a distinguished religious leader, and will be attended by students, faculty and townspeople. Most of the churches of the State College community join with the College in the Sunday evening vesper service.

The speaker on each Sunday evening is chosen from a different denominational organization in order that as wide a variety as possible may be provided. On Sunday evening, July 7th, Dr. Benard C. Clausen, pastor of the First Baptist Church, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, will deliver the first of these addresses. Dr. Clausen has appeared frequently at the College during the regular year and its summer sessions, and his messages are always vigorous, interesting and helpful.

On Sunday evening, July 14th, the address will be given by Dr. Ralph W. Sockman, pastor of Christ Methodist Church, New York City. Dr. Sockman is also an old friend of State College, who always brings a stimulating, thought-provoking, and inspiring sermon.

Dr. Edward L. Israel, rabbi of the Har-Sinai Congregation at Baltimore, Maryland, is the speaker for the vesper service at 7 30 on Sunday evening, July 21st. Rabbi Israel is a leader among the younger generation of Hebrews in America, and has spoken frequently before State College audiences.

Dr. Raymon Kistler will represent the Presbyterian Church in the vesper service on Sunday evening, July 28th. Dr. Kistler has recently been made president of Beaver College at Jenkintown, Pennsylvania, and will be looked forward to by those who have heard him in previous summers.

The concluding service of the series, on August 4th, will be addressed by Rev. Vincent C. Donovan, O. P., of the Roman Catholic church. Father Donovan has been one of the moving spirits in the development of tolerance and understanding among religious sects in America and those who are fortunate enough to hear him will be well repaid for their efforts.

The pastors of the local churches in State College participate in the vesper services, and are glad to be consulted by summer session students who seek their guidance.
