Freshmen and transfers were requested by Harriet Singer '41, Panhellenic Council president, last night to answer all party invitations by telephone as soon as they receive them since sorority women cannot make final plans without the number of guests.

Contrary to last year's policy, sorority women need not include their own expenses for cokes, movies, and the like in daily expense sheets, but all expenses of rushees must be submitted to Panhellenic Rushing Chairman Jean H. Krauser '42 and kept within the \$20 limit.

We, The Women— Rushees Embarrassed By Mobbing Greeks

A rush which surpassed the fight for Artist Course tickets and equalled any subway jam on record began when the official Panhellenic gun sounded at noon yesterday.

In fact, the sorority stampede to telephones and freshman rooms began before the whistle legally blew.

Since almost all sororities jumped the gun to capture dates for the Rec Hall events last night it is useless to point criticism at one or two houses.

But against the system which allowed wholesale embarrassments for both freshman and sorority women a case can be made.

Elbows jabbed competing sorority women out of the way and otherwise dignified coeds lost their dignity in the mad scramble for priority rights with rushees.

But the most embarrassing situations were undoubtedly experienced by the freshman women, who were pounced upon by three or four women from different houses and had to choose (in front of all of them) which to accompany to Rec Hall.

Surely Panhellenic Council didn't anticipate such a chaotic response to the opening of formal rushing season and surely freshmen didn't bargain for the horde of Greeks which pushed into their rooms at noon yesterday.

We don't blame the sorority women, for it was a case of the "early bird gets the worm." And we can't blame the rushing code, for as it stands no mobbing was legalized in black and white.
