In the 25-yard backstroke, Ruth Lawson '43, edged out Eleanor Arnold '41 by 3 seconds. Kay Porter '41 also downed Marg Kehler '43 by 2 seconds in the 25-yard crawl.

Group events gave the seniors the edge as they defeated sophs in the 100-yard freestyle relay, but juniors captured the 75-yard medley in 1.1 minutes with sophs as runners-up.

### Congrats, Criticisms Of 1940-1941 Rushing

Contrary to pre-bid estimates that the number of coeds joining sororities would decrease this year, the number was increased by 14. This seems a small increase when we consider that women's enrollment goes up each year, but in reality the low scholastic average of the freshman women's class as compared to the past few classes probably accounts for the slight increase.

To hash over the rushing code—congratulations to Panhellenic Council and the dean of women's staff for the speed with which the lists were compiled Sunday afternoon... the system of distributing invitations to freshmen for rush parties was effective with the exception of town women who, in many cases, failed to receive theirs until the following day...

We suggest more open houses first semester but advise that free contact rules be revised so that both freshmen and sorority women might be relieved of the rushing tension which lasted during the entire first semester... continuance of the same silent periods... and we advise investigating the advantages of a preferential ballot which would be filled out by rushees at the close of the first week of formal rushing season...

Congratulations to Panhellenic Council's executive committee for excellent interpretation of the rushing code... best wishes to the 163 women who have joined the vast world of the Greeks.

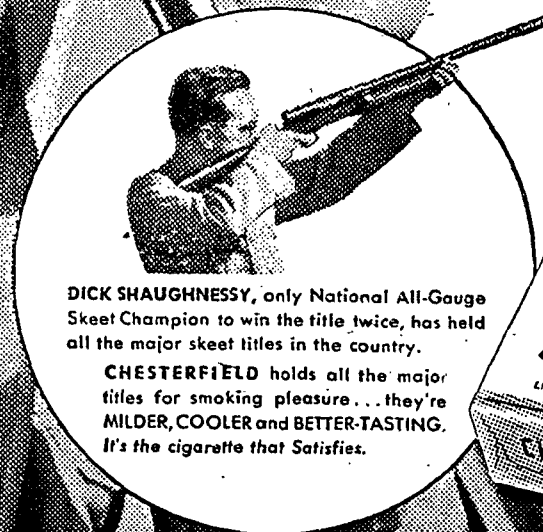
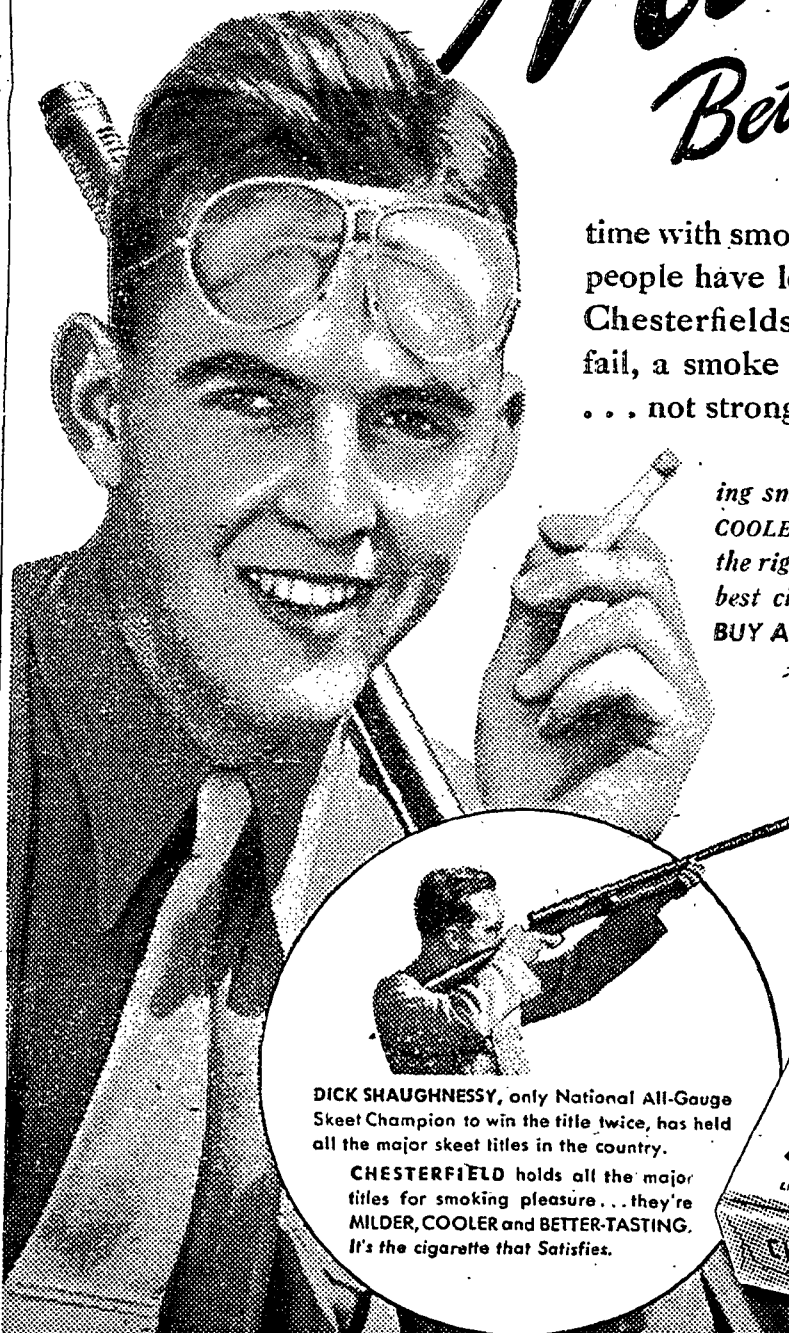
