

MIT, Princeton Today In Triangular Battle Lion Gymnasts Meet

The Lion gym team will enter the triangle meet against Princeton and Massachusetts Institute of Technology at Princeton this afternoon a strong favorite to cop the day's honors and clinch third place in the Eastern Intercollegiate League.

Today's meet will close the season for Coach Gene Weststone's gymnasts whose narrow 28 to 26 defeat by Temple last week knocked them out of the running for the title. The only contest remaining on the schedule is the Eastern Intercollegiate Championship meet at Boston on Saturday, March 22, when the individual titles will be decided.

Roman Pieo, Sol Small, and Lew Bordo will once again lead the State forces, the three having accounted for practically all the Lion scoring this year. Other gymnasts making the trip are Captain Ben Stahl, Jack Krause, Charlie Senft and John Teti.
