The Ellen H. Richards Instiestablished in any college or university, has been inaugurated at the College following approval of the Board of Trustees at their January meeting.

The Institute, administered jointly through the School of Ag-Chemistry and Physics, is a consolidated working research unit covering investigations formerly carried on by the department of home economics and the Agriculfural Experiment Station.

Research data accumulated will lead to the improvement of standards of living in food, shelicr, and clothing. Studies in textile technology, carried on in the department of chemistry since 1919, are included in the Instiinte work.
