

3 Lion Matmen Enter National Tourney At Lehigh

Pieo Handicapped By Finger Injury For Eastern Intercollegiate Meet

Fresh from clinching individual scoring honors in the dual meet season, Roman Pieo, State's ace-gymnast, is nursing a sprained finger and may find himself severely handicapped in the Eastern Intercollegiate League individual championships at Boston on Saturday.

Pieo hurt himself in the Princeton meet a week ago. The finger is in a splint temporarily, but unless it heals very rapidly the Lion ace's hopes for the individual all-around title are very slim. Roman was conceded an excellent chance to take the all-around crown away from Ed Danser, Temple star.

Temple's well-balanced gym team added Navy to its list of victims Saturday and gained the undisputed team championship with an undefeated slate. The Lions finished in third place.

Ridenour, Gleason, Scalzo Seek Titles

After blasting through the Eastern Intercollegiate last weekend for a lone Penn State individual championship, Little Charlie Ridenour will team up with Captain Frank Gleason and Senior Joe Scalzo to train for the National Collegiate Athletic Association tourney in Bethlehem Friday and Saturday.

Coach Charlie Speidel will not be able to enter a full squad at Lehigh, but this trio is certain to compete with Kerns a probable fourth. Scalzo was runner up in the 145-pound class in 1939 and Gleason, despite his surprise upset in New York, is rated high in the 136-pound class.

Penn State was named as host for the 1942 Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling association tournament and Captain Bob Eberle of Princeton was selected the outstanding wrestler in a coaches' meeting after Saturday's finals.

Clair Hess, Lion 128-pounder, deadlocked Yale and Princeton in a 21-point tie in the last bout of the tournament when he defeated Yale's Brook Parker in a thrilling, overtime bout, 6-5, for third place honors.

Penn and Yale followed with 17 points, Penn State 16, Lehigh 7, Cornell 6, Army 2, Columbia and Syracuse 1, and Harvard -5.
