Committee Begins Tabulation For Activities Point System

Tabulation of points to be allotted to offices and memberships in women's activities was begun yesterday by a WSGA Senate committee. The system will go into effect next fall under supervision of the two Junior Senators.

Under the system, coeds' activities will be limited by two point quotas—one for organization offices, another for memberships.

A survey of time and responsibilities required for each office and membership in 61 coed organizations was taken to enable an accurate scaling of points. Sorority officers will be interviewed this week and the average number of hours necessary for each office determined.

Apportioning points will be started by scaling similar activities, such as honoraries and councils, in relation to each other. Classifications will then be broken down and all activities arranged by points in descending order.

is encouraging men to complete their college educations, applicants may be examined and, if successful, have their names placed on the eligibility list for future appointment.

Flying cadets receive \$75 a month not including board, lodging, and uniforms. After completion of the course, cadets are commissioned second lieutenants with pay and allowances up to \$245 a month.

Students on the flying cadet eligibility list would undoubtedly be deferred from the draft. Persons accepted by the U. S. Military Academy or U. S. Naval Academy are placed in Class I-C (member of land or naval forces of the United States) and, although it is not specifically stated in the Selective Service regulations, potential air force cadets will probably be in the same group.
