

Scarab Plans Arts Ball; Elects 5 New Officers

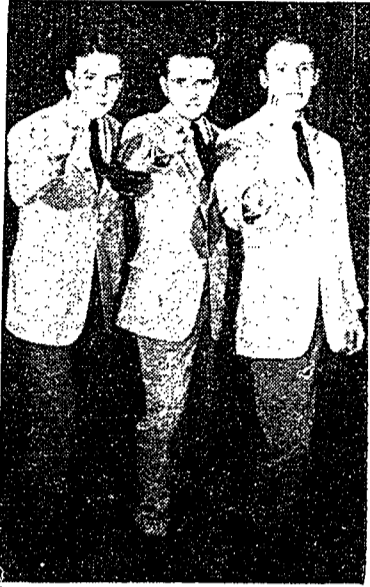

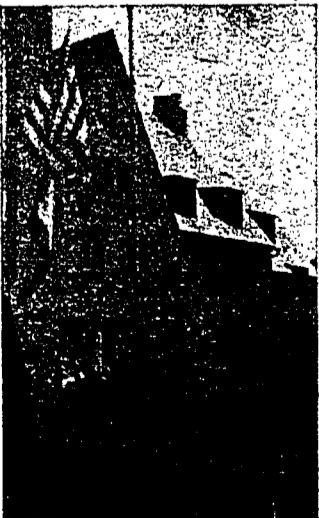
