**Face Gettysburg Here At 2:30 p.m. Tomorrow**

Catching and batting practice were emphasized by Coach Joe Bedenk in this week's drill sessions in preparation for the Nittany baseballers' encounter with Gettysburg on Beaver Field tomorrow afternoon.

Weakness at the plate and poor catching were the chief causes of Easter week losses to Penn and Princeton. In the season's opener in Philadelphia last Friday the Lions were pounded for 12 hits and an 8-3 defeat by the Quakers. They moved to Princeton on Saturday and absorbed an 8-4 clanging by the Tigers.

Jim Richardson, fresh from an engineering inspection trip, started on the mound against the Red and Blue nine but was replaced in the second inning by Wes Smith, sophomore righthander. Veteran Chuck Medlar went the route in the Princeton game and yielded 10 hits.

An entirely revamped infield will take the field against Gettysburg tomorrow. Facing the absence of Captain Eddie Sapp, away on a field trip, Coach Bedenk will bring Bill Debler in from the outfield to take over at first.

Sophomore Bill Mazzocco will probably start at the second sack with Freddy Ball at third while Whitey Thomas will remain at shortstop.

**Lacrosse Team Drops Two Tilts**

Still smarting from defeats administered by Navy, 13-4, and the University of Maryland, 12-3, during the Easter vacation, a determined Lion lacrosse team will seek its first victory of the season from Swarthmore at Swarthmore Field tomorrow.

The Lions performed creditably over the weekend considering they tackled the two topnotch tens in the country. Inexperience and lack of previous competition proved their undoing in both battles which saw the Nittany men off to a slow start in the first half and put up a stout defense in the final two periods.

Navy had little trouble spilling the green Nittany stickmen, 13-4, Saturday. The Middies, scoring in every period, registered a 3-0 lead by the end of the first quarter, and led the Lions 7-1 by the end of the first half.

The Thielmen's initial tally came late in the second period when Jim Riddell, Lion out home, took a pass from Al Blair, veteran center, who has returned after a year's absence, and scored smartly on a difficult angle shot.

Blair himself scored twice for the Lions in the second half, and Captain Bud Dattlebaum added a fourth marker.

A second setback was handed the Lions on Monday when they
