No such units exist on campus or in town and the suggestion to make women's houses independent has not been previously introduced.

The petition to change the present set-up was submitted with 21 student names before Easter vacation. The counter request received yesterday had 40 Grange supporters. Both Grange and non-Grange residents signed the first petition.
