Mary Browne Holds Belief In Self Is Success Factor

"Everyone has potentialities to do anything he wants if he works hard enough," asserted Mary K. Browne, former national singles and doubles tennis champion, in an interview Saturday night.

"Belief in ones' power and cosmic self, along with determination, is necessary to achieve," the Lake Erie College teacher went on, bubbling with energy, even after another full day of tennis.

Miss Browne has been proving this by her accomplishments, especially in the past few years, when she studied portrait painting with remarkable success and mastered Liszt's "Hungarian Rhapsody" on a wager. Within five years she had sold \$900 worth of pictures, and within 300 practice hours she developed her piano technique.

"Each spring I am a guest instructor at five women's colleges for one week. I'd rather talk philosophy, but I teach tennis," she grinned. Golf, painting, and battleboard, a variation of tennis, fill the rest of my time."
