A conference on the relation between high schools and colleges, sponsored by a unit of the State Association of Deans, will be held in the WSGA room in White Hall from 2:30 to 4:30 p. m. tomorrow, preceded by a luncheon in the Sandwich Shop at 1:30 p. m.
