president (junior), secretary (senior), and treasurer (sophomore) The Senate which ultimately con trols all business dealing with women students is presided over by the WSGA president while the vice-president presides over the Touse of Representatives
In addition to officrs, Senate is composed of one senior, two junlor, one sophomore; and two women will name one Senator son after college opens, and Senate will appoint another. Ex-officio members are Judicial chairman, editor of Co-Edition, and Collegian women's editor.
Members of the House of Representatives, the lower legislative group, include the president and dormitories, a representative from each sorority, and a town representative.
