

IM Head Plans 273 Men Pledge Fraternities In First Four Days Fall Program

Entries from both fraternities and independent groups are now being accepted in 213 Rec Hall for the fall intramural program which will begin soon after the start of classes, Eugen C. Bischoff, director of intramural athletics, announced yesterday.

Included in this fall's schedule will be touch football, cross-country, swimming, and horseshoes. Entry fees will be \$1 a team for football and swimming, and 25 cents a man for the other two sports.

Only doubles play will be included in the horseshoe pitching. Any number of runners may compete in the cross-country event, but only the first three on each team will be counted.

As in past years, all contestants in football, cross-country, and swimming must present a College physician's permit. The hill and dalers are also required to run the course at least 10 times prior to the meet.

Alpha Chi Sigma won the fraternity intramural trophy in last year's competition. Sigma Alpha Epsilon was runner-up and was followed by Phi Delta Theta, Delta Upsilon, Sigma Chi, and Kappa Delta Rho.
