When Old Main chimes 12 noon Wednesday, freshman women's no dating period will end, WSGA Senate decided last night.

From then until second semester freshman women will be permitted to date during the week until 5:30 p. m., and will be allowed a one o'clock and ten o'clock permission over weekends. Sunday dates must end at 5 p. m.

This weekend one o'clock permissions have been granted for the Collegian Dance Friday night. However, freshmen are not allowed to date Saturday night.

Permission for the Collegian Dance does not include dinner dates at fraternity houses Friday evening, Jean Babcock '42, WSGA Senate president, announced.

Special 10:30 permission for out-of-town guests over Alumni weekend may be procured. A one o'clock must be forfeited the following weekend for special permissions.

Hostesses have been requested to keep a strict list of women taking special guest permission. This list will be checked every week to ascertain whether a freshman woman is permitted a one o'clock permission.
