Plans to streamline the WSGA Constitution were submitted to Senate members last night for titudy and consideration after a penior senator constitution cominittee had examined and supplemented proposals made last year.

The constitution committee consisting of Jean Babcock, Anne M. Borton, Betty J. Patton, Jeanne C. Stiles and Mildred W. Taylor, inade proposals for including specific qualifications, responsibilities, appointments, and installations for all coeds concerned with WSGA bodies.

"The original Constitution, which has never been altered, if problems,' Miss Babcock, president, stated.

WSGA branches which have been considered in the proposals by the committee are Senate, House of Representatives, Freshman Council, Junior Service Board, and Judicial.




