### Need Pep At 8 A. M. See The Calcium Display

If you need pep for your eight o'clocks and cheer for your five o'clocks, see the calcium exhibit in 209 Home Economics Building from 8 a. m. to noon today. This is the fifth in a series of weekly nutritional exhibits by junior nutrition classes.

Part of the display will show foods containing one-tenth adult calcium requirements and another will compare amounts of calcium in different foods to that in one glass of milk.

Albino rats, in their third week of observation, show effects of deficient diets. Recent rat studies conducted by Dr. Harry C. Sherman of Columbia University show that an adequate diet enriched with calcium results in better health, added vigor and a ten per cent increase in life cycle.

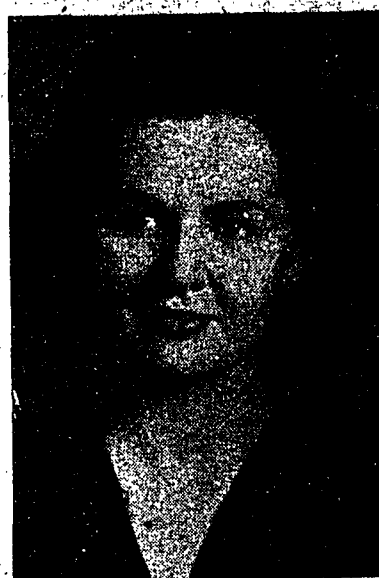
