the Japanese surprise assault on Pearl Harbor.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Frank Knox, secretary of the Navy, announced last night that the work of a large efficient fifth column and the lack of vigilance by our forces were the causes of the success of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. Knox described the enemy fifth column as the most efficient of the war so far, with the possible exception of the fifth column in Norway.

WASHINGTON, D. C.—House Military Affairs Committee yesterday approved a bill calling for the registration of all men from 18 to 64, and making all those from 21 to 44 eligible for the draft.

TOKIO—The Japanese High Command warned the Japanese people last night of the danger of American submarines lurking in Japan's territorial waters.
