Training Grounds' squad in Rec Hall at 7 p. m. tomorrow.

At-121-pound Charlie Ridenour, last season's EIWA champ, mixes with clever Captain Herb Van Brewer of Princeton, talented Sam Harry will prepare for Ira Griffin, undefeated 128-pounder.

Further strengthening the visitors' powerful lightweight division will be Gene Taylor, 136-pound EIWA title-holder last year. Clair Hess and Ronal Crisman are battling to fill the Penn State slot.

Intra-squad competition also is heated in the 165-pound weight where Jay Kelley or Ralph Sayre will represent the Lions. Sayre is favored to start.
