## Handball, Volley Ball Eliminations Continue

In another lopsided game, Pi Kappa Phi ran roughshod over Phi Kappa, 26 to 10. Paul Willhide of Pi Kappa Phi tallied nine counters to lead in scoring. In a slow and rough tilt, Alpha Chi Sigma nosed out the Delta Upsilon five, 10 to 6 after leading 3 to 1 at the half.

Scoring honors for the evening went to Bill "Bull" Laughlin of the Alpha Gamma Rho five who accounted for 12 points in his team's 18 to 9 win over Delta Theta Sigma.

A 15 to 0 lead at the half was enough for the Irvin Hall frosh to coast to a 21 to 16 victory over the Forestry Society. John Bennett took scoring honors for the winners with 11 counters.
