"For instance," he said, "Philotes represents only about 50 individual independent women who come from no groups at all. And IMA, although it is more representative, is not able to reach over half the independent men; largely those living in small rooming houses. Under the new system of representation, every independent student will have the opportunity to vote for his or her representative to Cabinet and thus have a voice in student government."

Action was taken that the arrangement of booths at Rec Hall dances should not obstruct exits and should comply with fire regulations as well as the grounds and building department's inspection. This legislation was prompted by the unusually large attendance
