## *Revised Text Of Student Government Constitution

Following is the complete text of the Constitution of the PennSylvania State College Studen 1939, revised March 26, 1942. PREAMBLE
We, the students of the Pennsylform antritre representative union, to promote the welfare of the student body and the College as a whole and to insure the democratic right: of self-government do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution of the Pennsylvania State College
Association.

Section 6. The Student Tribunal shall have power, after a fair trial, to affix such punishment as it may deem justifiable upon any detrimental to the College, and may recommend, when necessary, penalties up to and including expulsion from 'College.

Trial Procedure
Section -7. The Student Tribu ts own trial procedure, except tha any hearing must be open if the defendant so desires.

ARTICLE IV

## Class Officers

Section 1. Each class shall elect
president, vice-president, secre-
tary and treasurer at a time specified by the Elections Committee and approved by the Cabinet. The Freshman Class shall be organized
as soon as advisable after the opening of the first semester under the direction of the Elections Com mittee.

Presidential Succession Section 2. The class vice-president shall succeed to the office of president upon the resignation or Section Eligibility Section 3.
