

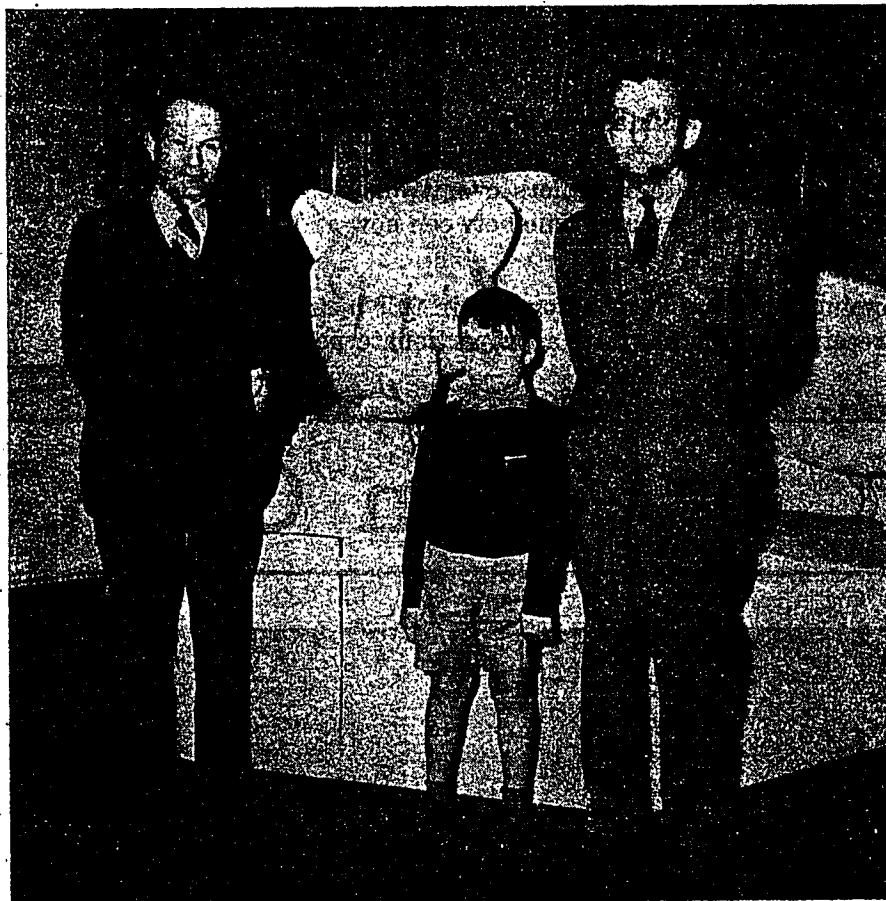
Alumni Carry Nittany Glory In Many Callings

Cross-Indexed Files Locate Penn State Graduates

A careful record of each alumnus is kept by the Alumni Association in the five files maintained at the Alumni Office. A master file includes the names of 30,000 Penn State grads, Mont Alto Foresters, Two Year Ags, and non-grads in alphabetical order. A Biographical File contains all the information about the former students' pre-college and post college days. An Addressograph File contains the post office addresses of each of the 30,000. The list of alumni located in any particular city can be found in the Geographic Card File. For the convenience of class secretaries, a Card File by Classes is also kept.
