

**258 Freshmen Coeds Reserve Dorm Rooms**

Miss Nina M. Bentley, assistant dean of women, has announced that 258 freshman coeds drew for dormitory rooms for either Summer semester, Fall semester, or both. Of all coeds returning this Summer 438 will stay in Atherton Hall and 70 in Grange Dormitory.

Coeds attending Summer semester will receive room reservation cards today, and a room deposit of ten dollars must be paid by May 7.

**Panhel To Install Keller As Prexy; Council Approves Rushing Details**

Pauline E. Keller '43, Alpha Omicron Pi, will automatically become Panhellenic president and Beatrice M. White '44, Phi Mu, Council vice-president, according to the Panhellenic rotating system, at the installation coffee hour in southeast Atherton Hall from 6:45 to 7:45 p. m. today.

Other officers, elected at the Council meeting last night, who will be installed tonight are Margaret L. Maginnis '44, secretary; Suzanne M. Hay '44, treasurer; and Miss Ruth H. Zang, assistant to the dean of women, alumnae advisor. Miss White will act as Panhellenic rushing chairman.

Details of the proposed rushing code for Summer and Fall semesters were presented by Miss Keller, retiring rushing chairman, and were unanimously accepted by Greek representatives.

Under the new code, which will be sent to the Senate Committee on Student Welfare for final approval, there will be a strict silent period from June 8 to June 17.

Free association, lasting for the week of June 17 to June 23 will follow. Visiting hours will be from 8 a. m. to 6 p. m. daily. During this time, sorority women may go to rooms of freshmen and transfers, and the latter may visit in sorority houses and suites.

Chapel and church dates, outlined last year, will be permissible. Rushing will not be permitted outside of State College and no limit will be put on the number of fraternity women with freshmen and transfers. Breakfast, luncheon, and dinner dates will be prohibited.

Starting at 6 p. m. June 23, a strict silent period will go into effect until 8 a. m. July 13, during which time there will be two scheduled open houses. First of these will be Thursday, June 26, and the second, Wednesday, July 1. Open houses will last from 4 to 5:30 p. m.

Formal rushing will begin with free contact starting Monday, July 13, and ending Saturday, July 18. Association this week will continue to be from 8 a. m. to 6 p. m. Restrictions of other free association periods will hold during formal rushing. Two informal parties will be scheduled by each house this week, invitations being sent for only one party at a time.

Climaxing the week, each house will hold two formal coffee hours on Saturday, July 18, from 5:30 to 7 p. m. and from 7:30 to 9 p. m. Invitations will be issued Friday night and written replies must be in by 10 a. m. Saturday.

A strict silent period will prevail from 9 p. m. Friday to 5 p. m. Saturday and another will go into effect from 9 p. m. Saturday until results of bids are announced on Sunday, July 19.

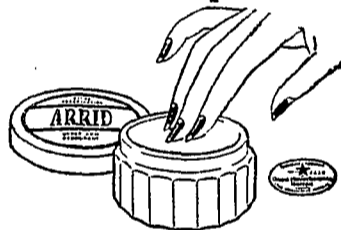
