With a record of four wins in seven starts to its credit, the tennis team encounters a strong Penn net squad on the varsity courts at 2 p. m. today.

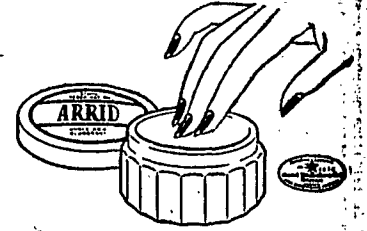
Although the Quakers have been stopped by Yale and Navy earlier in the season, they are expected to provide the Roethkemen with one of their stiffest battles of the current campaign.
