

570 Coeds Return To Live in Dorms

Penn State women do not change their minds, according to latest reports on rooming arrangements from Miss Nina M. Bentley, assistant to the dean of women.

Atherton Hall which tops the list, will house 347 coeds. Grange Dormitory will be the home of 67 women, and 108 sorority women will live in houses and suites not in Atherton or Grange. Approximately 48 students will live in co-operative houses.

Town dorms will not be open to undergraduate women students, but may be inhabited by Summer session students, stated Miss Bentley.

Freshmen will live in Women's Building and McAllister Hall.

Women's organizations are urged by Margaret K. Sherman '43, WSGA president, to eliminate unnecessary activities and to replace them with defense projects in conjunction with WSGA's war-time policy.

Miss Sherman said that it is imperative for all coed groups to consider seriously the letters which they will receive from WSGA requesting that projects be formulated with the purpose of contributing to the national war effort and of conserving time, money, and energy.

She also pointed out that, under the accelerated program, adequate rest and recreation are vital requisites for successful work.

According to Miss Sherman, WSGA will continue its policies of considering petitions for committee appointments and office nominations, and of inviting guests to Senate meetings. Special late permissions will not be granted except for campus activities.

Although modified to fit the new schedule, freshman orientation plans are similar to last year's and include mixers sponsored by honoraries. WSGA will probably publish a special booklet for new coeds and strengthen transfer orientation, said Miss Sherman.

A substitute senior senator will be named to replace Nancy E. Gosser '43, who will not return for the Summer semester.

Senate will meet in the WSGA room at 6:30 p. m. Wednesday.
