

Freshman Counselors To Leave For Diamond Valley Camp This Friday

Stein Selects Eleven To Help Staff Camp

Counselors for Freshman Camp were selected yesterday by Gerald B. M. Stein '44, camp director, completing the roster of the staff which leaves Friday morning with the first group of freshman to attend the Penn State orientation camp.

Eleven upper-classmen were selected to counsel the freshman who are expected to arrive in State College early Friday morning prior to leaving for the Diamond Valley camp near Petersburg, Penna.

Counselors selected by Stein include Jose B. Lombana '44, Robert S. MacNabb '45, Ralph W. Harris '45, John C. York '43, Reagan Houston '45, Howard W. Carlson '45, Michael A. Blatz '45, Herbert K. Kraybill '44, Clifford M. Painter '44 and John N. Adsit '45.

After registering at the PSCA office in Old Main, the freshmen will be taken to the camp and assigned counselors and cabins.

During the three days at camp, the freshmen will hear twenty-five campus leaders and members of the faculty discuss problems that arise in making the adjustment from high school life to college life.

"Recreation, songfests, campfires and time out for meals are sprinkled amply between the many discussion sessions, Stein said, "to keep the week-end enjoyable as well as informative."

Campers have been advised, therefore, to bring along an ample supply of sports wear. Several senior Red Cross life savers will be taken to the camp so that swimmer can be afforded protection while swimming. Stein reminded students and faculty that they were welcome to visit the camp Saturday afternoon.

Phys Ed School Plans Symposium

Because relatively few school teachers or civic leaders are equipped to serve as instructors in either square dancing or modern social dancing, the School of Physical Education will hold a Dance Symposium from June 22 to 26.

Albert E. Haynes, of Sudbury, Mass., who will conduct similar classes at Harvard this Summer, will serve as instructor in the five-day symposium. Haynes is nationally known as an exponent of square dancing. He will be assisted by the resident faculty.

Emphasis during the symposium will be placed on early American square dancing, rapidly growing popular in this community. Students attending the regular Summer sessions are expected to take the dance instruction.

Instruction in modern social dancing will include basic steps and patterns for beginners, teaching procedures for school and community classes, and advanced or present-day steps and patterns.

Greyhound Lines Cut Schedules

Elimination of two scheduled runs between State College and Harrisburg, a top speed of forty miles per hour, and the abolishment of all charter service for the duration become effective tomorrow on Pennsylvania Greyhound Bus Lines, according to a statement issued yesterday by L. H. Ristow, general traffic manager.

In addition to these, a 25 per cent reduction in scheduled mileage, tightened restrictions on the use of second sections, and the elimination of express and limited service will also become effective throughout the state in compliance with a request by the government for general curtailment of all bus and train service.

The bus ordinarily scheduled to leave State College for Harrisburg at 10 a. m., and the bus arriving in State College from Harrisburg at 10 p. m. will be discontinued as a result of the new policy.

All other Greyhound buses will run approximately 40 minutes later.

"Effective Wednesday all our schedules start operating on a forty-mile-per-hour basis and that means that our new timetables are set so that no driver need exceed that speed," Mr. Ristow stated.
