

Theil Coaches North In New York's USO Benefit Music Tryouts Set Next Week

Gotwals, Mitchell To Accompany Coach

Coach Nick Thiel, who last week brought the All-Star North lacrosse team to victory over the South in the annual post-season game at Baltimore, has again been chosen head mentor of another North team which will meet a Southern team in the big USO benefit Sports Day program at the Polo Grounds in New York City.

Aiming for another win over the South, Thiel will take with him Jim Gotwals and Tom Mitchell, Lion stars selected to represent Penn State at the All-Star game.

Gotwals, a star defenseman and captain-elect, and Tom Mitchell, outstanding attacker for Coach Thiel, played major roles in the Northern victory last week.

The Lion trio will depart for New York City sometime next week to join the other members of the 12-man squad which has been selected to play. From these players Thiel will field a starting ten.

The exhibition lacrosse game is part of the Sports Day program, planned to raise money for the USO to provide recreational facilities for men in the service. The lacrosse show will be a 25-minute battle.

Opposing teams, North and South, will be selected from 17 eastern seaboard colleges. All-Star North stickmen will come from Penn State, Yale, Hobart, Union College, Syracuse, and Princeton.

Freshmen will, however, be eligible for tryouts for the marching band to be held sometime in August and for ROTC band, shortly after their arrival here.

Freshmen tryouts for men's glee club and College choir will be held next Tuesday and Wednesday. Men trying out for glee club and choir are asked to report to 200 Carnegie Hall at 7 p. m., Tuesday, and women trying out for choir are to report to 211 Carnegie Hall at 7 p. m., Wednesday.

A special schedule for the symphony orchestra requires that it run only for six weeks, June 29-August 8, during Summer session. Rehearsals will be held daily and men and women are eligible for tryouts.
