**College Blacked Out Twice In Recent Weeks;
 Dr. Shigley Praises Student Cooperation**

Penn State has seen two blackouts in close succession in the past few weeks, the first one occurring while the students were out of town and the second before they had settled down to serious study.

In each case, no violations were reported, and Dr. James F. Shigley, chairman of the State College Defense Council, praised the cooperative attitude of the students during the test. Indications at present point to a blackout of at least several hours for the next time. However, no official announcement has yet been made. During blackouts in the com-
