

Frosh To Pick Two Leaders

WSGA Senate voted last night to make compulsory attendance of freshman women at the meeting scheduled for nomination of WSGA freshman senator and WRA representative in 110 Home Economics Building at 6:30 p. m. Tuesday. Elections will be held Tuesday, June 30.

Penalty for absence from either meeting will be removal of an 11 o'clock, said Margaret K. Sherman '43, WSGA president. Campus freshmen with legitimate excuses will present them to dormitory checkers before 5 p. m. Tuesday. Downtown coeds will present excuses to the dean of women's office.

Senator and WRA representative nominations will be made from the floor, announced Patricia E. Diener, sophomore senator, and Julia M. MacFarland, sophomore WRA representative. Qualifications of the nominee, such as high school activities, must accompany each nomination.

Following nominations freshman women are urged to attend freshman song practice and pep rally in Schwab Auditorium at 7 p. m., said Miss Sherman.

Ten o'clocks have been granted by Senate to permit freshman coeds to attend church receptions from 8 p. m. to 10 p. m. tomorrow. They may take one of their two monthly one o'clock permissions for Collegian Dance Saturday. Dinner dates will not be permitted, according to Miss Sherman.

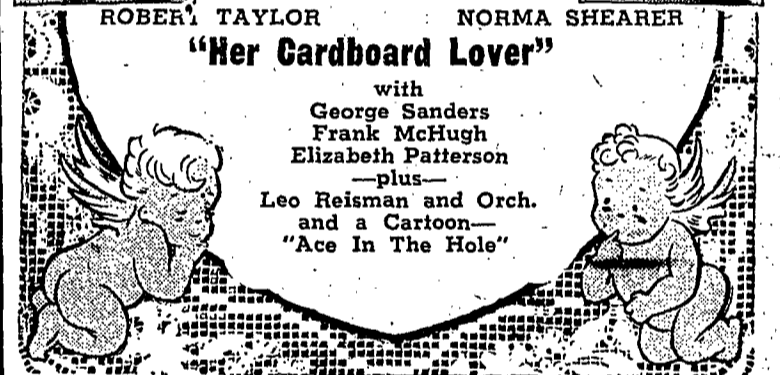
