Just how important it is that the three addresses are correct which will be required on the registration blanks that more than, 2,000. 18-20 students will sign when registering for Selective Service in the Armory, on Tuesday, was pointed out by Edward K. Hibshman, executive secretary of the alumni and chairman of the College draft committee, yesterday.

Mr. Hibshman stated that one address will govern the local draft board to which students' registrations will be sent and another will be the address to which all official: mail for the registrant is sent by the local board. The third should be the address of a person who will always know where the registrant is located.

The programs include some special music furnished by the department and special Summer sessions announcements will be made during the course of the programs each week.


