

Frosh Baseballers Phi Sigs Upset DU, 13-4; Beat Presbys, 9-8 TKE, Delts Vie For Title

Running amuck in the first inning of a seven frame game against the Presbyterian nine of the State College Church League, Penn State's freshman baseball team eked out a 9-8 victory on the New Beaver Field diamond last night.

Twelve yearlings came to bat against Bud Carruthers in the first inning of the game, took him for five hits and scored seven runs with the help of five errors committed by the Church Leaguers.

Although Carruthers pitched better ball than Jack Berlin, yielding five hits against 11 given by the frosh hurler, the Presbyterians were weak in fielding, racking up seven errors.

Coach Houck found consistent and well-balanced playing from Fred Shaw at first base, who turned in eight put outs with two spectacular overhead catches. Other outstanding frosh were Bud Davage, who hit two singles for four times at bat, scored two runs and stole two bases; Bud Waxman, with two runs and one hit; and pitcher Jack Berlin, who struck out seven men and turned in top notch fielding.

Starting lineup for Penn State included Gracey, third base; Davage, shortstop; Waxman, left field; Kreidler, center field; Shaw, first base; Mazzocco, second base; Battles, right field; Stern, catcher; and Berlin, pitcher.

Another landslide win, this one 23 to 1, was recorded by Alpha Chi Sigma over Pi Lambda Phi in Section 3. Bates had four for five at bat. Winning pitcher Weir hurled a three-hitter.

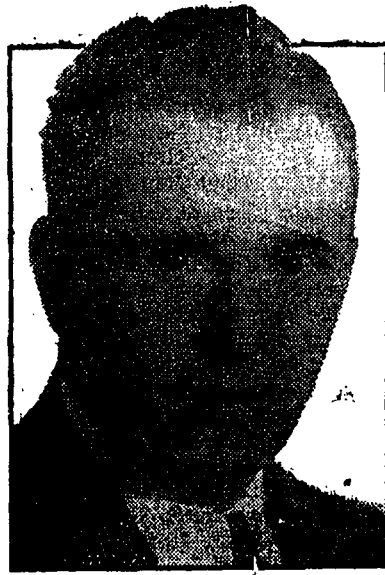

Fully-equipped new headquarters have been provided for the College's ESMWT Shipbuilding and Hull Design course, according to R. M. Gerhardt, associate professor of architectural engineering and course instructor.

Twenty-four eight foot drawing tables, built by the College's Grounds and Buildings department, have been installed in 303 Math Engineering Building for full-time use of the special drafting students, according to Professor Gerhardt. Special fluorescent lights have also been added.

Following the preparation of the new headquarters, the defense class moved from its temporary location in the Engineering School's aeronautical drafting room.

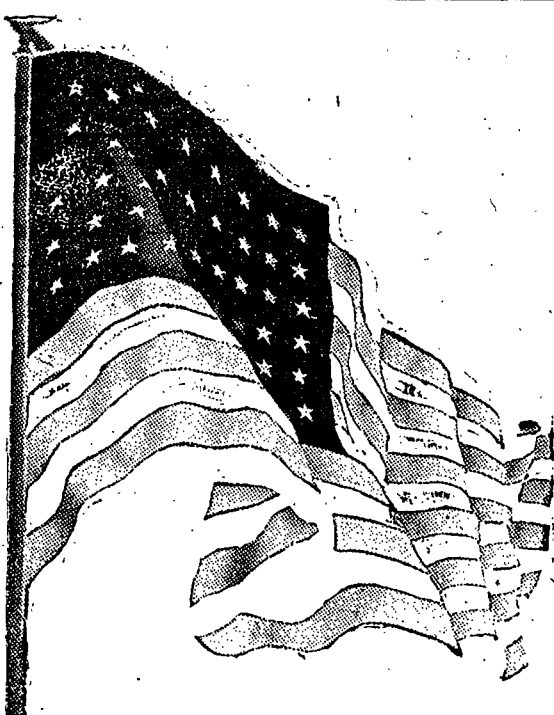
