Yeagley, Moriarta Star For Deltas; Gray Hurls Four Hit Game, Loses

A continuation of the two-way battle for the Interfraternity softball championship was assured last night when a powerful Phi Delta Theta team registered a 5-2 victory over the previously unbeaten Tau Kappa Epsilon squad, knotting the standings in fraternity Section 1 and making necessary a final playoff tilt next week.
Six errors in the field neutralized the five to four advantage that the Tekes marked up in the hit column and the effective twirling of pitcher Gray. For their part the Phi Deltas took advantage of every break, erred only once in the field, and played a smoother, more confident game.

Both teams scored a single unearned run in the first inning, the Tekes on a walk, an infield out and McKee's single over third. Six walks kept Phi Delt pitcher Yeagley in trouble throughout much of the game. Philips tallied on his single, a passed ball and error through third in the home half of the inning.

Phi Deltas went ahead when they tallied a single run in the last of the third, while TKE showed that they were still very much in the ball game when they tied the count with a marker in the fourth. The score now stood at 2-2.

Two Phi Delt runs in the final half of the fourth broke the saw-saw scoring and pushed the winners into a lead from which they were never headed. Third baseman Moriarta topped off a nice defensive game with a powerful four-bagger to left center that was the final nail in the TKE coffin.

Results of other intramural games found Matils, led by Reed with four for four, pounding out a 10-4 win over Watts Hall; Fairmount Hall treating the Miller Club unmercifully to the tune of a 21-10 lacing; Beta Sigma Rho eking out a 7-6 triumph over Beaver House; Goss pitching Theta Chi to a three hit 6-2 win over KDR; while Canal S. and Beta Theta Pi won by forfeit.
