> Dean Schott stated that this will be determined after the School forms definite plans for the program and it will depend on whether or not the new course is included on the School's list of elective courses.

However, he stated that if the course carries credit with it, it will be conducted as a regular class with marks given and certain required work. If the course is set up as a purely optional one, it will be up to upperclassmen to report at their own will, with work also of an optional nature.

At the present time a proposal is before the various deans to separate the required hygiene course for freshmen and sophomores from the required physical education program. Under this new plan the underclassmen would have three hours weekly of actual activity for one credit and they would also be required to take a one credit, one hour per week hygiene course.

Schott stated that the hygiene course would be considerably stiffened over the present one, since its academic value would be increased by about three times.
