One thing the student should remember at all times is the all-important fact that once a col-

lege student has received his questionnaire and notice of induction from his draft board, the college loses all jurisdiction over his case, and he is immediately ineligible for enlistment in any of the Officers Reserve branches of the service.

A student is never too early in seeking enlistment in any of the Army or Navy Reserve Corps. A few ex-Penn Staters now serving as privates in the army can testify to that.

Since Penn State is a land grant college with an established ROTC, the Army is given preference in enlisting students through the Army Enlisted Reserve Corps. Enlistment in this Corps guarantees the student the privilege of graduating before being called—provided he passes the qualifying mental examination given at the end of his sophomore year—and "earmarks" him for training at one of the Army's Officer Candidate Schools.

### Thespians Plan Mobile Shows

One of the first groups of its kind in the country to do so, the Penn State Thespians, College musical comedy producing organization, has set up a Mobile Unit plan which produces five or six shows each semester in army camps in the vicinity of the College.

The shows which have been presented so far have proven very successful and the units have been asked to return to the camps time and time again. The plan, with expense funds provided by contributions from campus organizations, will be continued during the Fall semester and further if possible, according to Edward R. Clauss '43.

Along with their unit shows the Thespians usually present one or two shows on the campus, usually on big weekends. Dates for their shows during the coming semesters have not yet been set because of the changes in the College program since the first of the year.

Their shows feature musical and comedy skits and dancing revues as created and arranged by members of the organization.
