

Coeds Hold Power In WSGA WRA Will Summon

Following the federal government's plan, the Women's Student Government Association is composed of two legislative bodies, a judicial committee, a junior service board, and a freshman council. Upon matriculation at the College, all women automatically become members and are subject to its rulings.

Senate, controlling head of the organization, in addition to officers, is composed of one senior, two juniors, one sophomore and two freshman senators. Entering freshmen will elect the second Freshman Senator at a mass meeting, to be held in Schwab Auditorium at 6:30 p. m. Tuesday, September 15. Ex-officio members are Judicial Chairman and Daily Collegian women's editor.

House of Representatives, the secondary legislative group, is presided over by WSGA vice-president as speaker of the House and includes the president and vice-president of each upperclass dormitory, a representative from each sorority, and a coed from town.

To try and penalize violators of WSGA rulings, the Judicial Committee is composed of two members of each class. Elected by Senate, Junior Service Board members aid in WSGA project work. Freshman Council, a group of Freshman dormitory presidents, discuss and solve freshman problems.

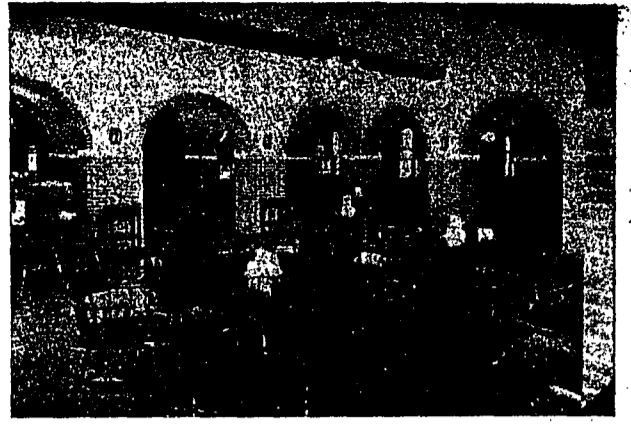
