Galbraith asked students to keep in mind the fact that the Army Enlisted Reserve Corps, except for direct enlistments in the Air Corps, Navy V-5 and V-7. is the sole enlistment agency for the reserve officer branches of the service at Penn State.

Freshmen and sophomores who or V-7 programs should enter the Army Enlisted Reserve Corps, from which they will be discharged upon application at the end of their sophomore year for subsequent transfer to the Navy V-5 or V-7, or any other specialized branch outside the Army Enlisted Reserve.
