"Target for Tonight," a motion picture which Quentin Reynolds says is "The finest picture to come out of the war," will be shown Wednesday night at 7 p. m. in Schwab Auditorium, Fred E. Kelly, coordinator of the audio-visual aids department of the College, announced yesterday.

"Penn State has been designated by the United States Government as a 'key information center' with the function of supplying to individuals and groups in central Pennsylvania information they may wish relating to the nation's war effort," Kelly said.

Two short war song films, "Caissons Go Rolling Along" and "Anchors Aweigh," will complete the one hour program.

Since the installation of the Penn State chapter over 500 members have been initiated. From the Gamma Phi chapter and other chapters have come such men as Alf Landon, William Seabrook, Newton D. Baker, and Calvin Coolidge.

Also headlined by Teddy Powell is newcomer Dick Judge, popular young baritone, who has become a favorite on Bluebird records.

Among the most popular of his recent recordings for Bluebird are "A Boy in Khaki-A Girl in Lace" and "There Will Never Be Another You." Both these hits were taken from the motion picture "Iceland," starring Sonja Henie, which opens today at the State Theater.

Teddy Powell has been acclaimed by New York as outstanding as a song writer, conductor, music arranger, and screen actor. He has appeared a number of times in motion pictures while still a member of Abe Lyman's band, and is a personal friend of the movie Powells.

Both Teddy and Dick Powell, not related, were featured by Lyman when Dick was known as a "crooner" and Teddy was establishing a name for himself as a composer and a guitar player.

Following the disastrous fire at the Rustic Cabin in New Jersey last season, which cost Powell approximately \$40,000 in equipment, the band underwent a complete reorganization, and has since played engagements at Atlantic City's Steel Pier, the Meadowbrook, and the Strand Theatre in New York City.
