

## Senate Schedules Election Date For WSGA Officers November 5

### Group Appointed To Aid Red Cross Coordination

Election date for WSGA officers is set for Thursday, November 5, it was decided at a meeting of WSGA Senate last night. A nomination mass meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 28, and primary elections will be held Tuesday, November 3.

Included on the election slate are president (senior, vice-president (junior), treasurer (sophomore), and one senior, junior, sophomore, town and independent senator. Defeated presidential candidate will become secretary, and the loser in the vice-presidential race will be the second junior senator.

Nominations committee made up of seniors on Senate includes Nancy E. Gosser, chairman, Louise M. Fuoss, Janet V. Holmes, and Marjorie L. Sykes. List of nominees will be presented to Senate for approval at next week's meeting. Additional nominations may be made from the floor at the mass meeting. Louise W. Henry '44 is chairman of the elections committee, assisted by Margaret Stern '45.

Sally L. Hirshberg '44 was named publicity chairman for the Red Cross work, and poster committee includes Rosalind M. Nelson '43, Helen D. McKee '44, and Lucille D. Weinstein '44.
