

Jones Calls Coeds To Roll Dressings

Women students are reminded by Dorothy L. Jones '44, acting WSGA vice-president and House of Representatives speaker, to attend the surgical dressings class which will meet in 112 Home Economics at 7:30 tonight.

To meet the town quota of 9,000 dressings per month, local Red-Cross authorities have stressed the need for additional workers.

Necessary equipment includes a coverall apron, scissors and a bandana to fasten about the head. Interested coeds should attend tonight's meeting with or without implements, Miss Jones stated.

As most dressings are sent directly to overseas hospitals, the life or comfort of a wounded soldier may depend on accuracy and the sanitary conditions maintained by workers. All work is subject to strict Army standards, Miss Jones said.

A Red Cross Volunteer Aid Pin will be awarded to those who put in 50 hours of work, Miss Jones continued. Mrs. Leonard A. Dogget, chairman of the local surgical dressings committee, will explain procedure and regulations at Thursday's meeting.

Cwens Announce Zang New Advisor

Some important services performed by Cwens include helping orientate freshman coeds, aiding in freshman registration, ushering at the Thespian show for Victory Weekend, providing entertainment for freshman coeds at a pajama party, and selling defense stamps.

The annual Cwen dance nets 50 dollars to two deserving sophomore coeds. Defense stamps are now being sold by the organization. To date approximately 35 dollars in stamps have been sold, not including proceeds of the mixer held in the Armory earlier this week.
