Experts are rating the Lions 8 to 5 favorites. But a Blue and hite team has never been able to defeat a Mountaineer squad on a West Virginia gridiron.

With the return of Quentin Barnette, the Mountaineers' great uarterback to the lineup, Coach Bill Kerr will be able to start seven men that started against the lions last year.


