NEW GUINEA-MacArthur's Australian troops have captured Kokoda, the vital Kokodan airfield, it was announced.

GERMANY - Rommel's headquarters announced that the British Eighth Army has broken through Axis fortifications. Australian troops are driving to the Mediterranean Sea and Allied planes are giving strong support to land forces, the statement continued.

-WASHINGTON - American forces are gaining in the Guadalcanal zone, the Navy Department announced. The Japanese fleet has been forced to retire and within the last 24 hours, 27 enemy ships have been sunk or damaged.
