Higginsmen Point To Penn After Syracuse Victory; Wozniak's Final Period Goal Wins For Booters, 1-0

Early Middy Defense **Thwarts Lion Scoring**

Playing his first complete game of the year, Walt Woznaik, used as a substitute forward in past games, kept the Penn State soccer team record unblemished when he scored in the final period of play to break a scoreless tie and give the Lions a hardearned victory over the Midshipmen of the Navy, 1-0, at Annapolis Saturday.

Completely outplaying Coach Jeffry's team during the first quarter, the Middies kept the action almost completely in Blue and White territory. The usual high-scoring forward line was able to make nary a shot at the Crabtown team's goal while Johnnie Struck, Penn State goalie, had to make five brilliant saves to keep the home team from scoring.

Gradually, in the second and third periods, the Jeffreymen penetrated Navy territory. Woznaik's kick into the opposing net came in the closing minutes of the final quarter and this turned what looked like an extra-period game into a Nittany victory, the sixth of the year for the booters.
