

Navy Wins 4-2 In Last Game Of Annual Series

Navy hockey team won the Army-Navy series with a 4-2 victory over Army on Holmes Field last night. Navy totaled two wins, 5-1 and 4-0; Army won one 5-0; and a fourth resulted in a 4-4 tie.

High scorer in yesterday's game was Navy's Betsy Robinson, inside right, with 3 goals; Anna Radle, center forward, tallied the other Navy point. Joan Finn, Army center forward, and Lou Schlichter, Army left wing, accounted for Army's two tallies.

Army Leads at Half

In the opening of the first half Navy attempted three goals, but was stopped by Eleanor Wills, Army center half, and Mary Ann Jennings, Army left back. On a pass from Wills, Joan Finn scored the first goal of the game. Army's other score and the first Navy tally came with three minutes remaining in the first half.

Betsy Robinson, Navy inside right, opened the second period with one of her three goals tallied for Navy. Army goalie Skip Scrivanich stopped Navy scoring attempts by Betsy McGee, inside left, but Robinson rushed two more goals in to give Navy the game and series.

Navy left wing, Helen Hooper, was absent from the line-up for the entire game.
