## WSGA Xmas Drive Falls Short Of Goal; Totals Only \$226.98

A total of \$226.98, little more than half the \$400 goal, was realized in the annual WSGA House of Representatives Christmas drive, which officially ended yesterday. However, in announcing the total, Miss Nina M. Bentley, assistant to the dean of women, said that more money would probably be reported today and tomorrow. She urged all coeds who still have money to turn in to do so today.

Atherton southwest led living units with a total contribution of \$21.46. Jordan Hall was in second place with \$18.57, and Irvin Hall was third with donations amounting to \$18.10. Sororities were led by Alpha Epsilon Phi with \$15, and Sigma Delta Tau with \$10.50.

Drive receipts will be divided among the Mifflin County Children's Aid Fund, Mrs. Hetzel's Emergency Loan Fund, and the American Women's Hospital Corps.

In addition to trying to alleviate the sufferings of civilians in war-stricken England, the Hospital Corps provides district nurses and other forms of medical aid to indigent Negroes and whites in the southern highlands of the United States.
