Dougherty, Judicial chairman, reminded underclassmen, however, that there are still too many infringements of customs and added that future permissions, specifically for Junior-Senior Ball weekend, will not be granted unless further improvement is evident. The chief offense, according to Miss Dougherty, is Sunday night dating.
