 We were quite active in the Pan-telleria campaign. Sure was quite a show. Happened to be in the last raid over the island, about 11:45 a.m., and the landing parties hit the shore at noon. We could see the vast array of landing barges just off the shore. The island itself was practically obscured by smoke and dust from bombings.

The sky was filled with bombers and fighters of all descriptions, practically all Allied, of course. 'Twas somewhat of a feather in our cap because the island fell from an air attack almost exclusively. Actually the Italians surrendered before noon, but the extent of our attacks was too great to stop instantly.

(Note: An earlier letter said he had bombed ahead of the British Eighth Army in its drive up the Tunisian coast—and presumably he is now in the Sicilian campaign.—ARW.)
