Student and borough motorists who use the campus roads were Gerson Miller and Robert Zie- who use the campus roads were cautioned today not to pass a column of troops which they over-

> The warning was issued by Capt. who pointed out that such action creates a traffic hazard and is an infraction of traffic regulations.

> Some motorists have explained, Captain Mark said, that they passed only after an approving signal had been given by an officer with the group.

> This signal should be ignored unless the line or column of troops consists of only one or two groups of men," Captain Mark said. In all other cases, he urged, drivers should follow the line until it stops or until the driver reaches an intersection where he can turn off.

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
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
