

Panhel Penalizes Kappas For Team Enroute So. Eligibility Rule Violation

Panhellic Council has penalized Kappa Kappa Gamma for an infraction of women's social fraternity eligibility rules, according to Panhel Council President Martha James. The fraternity committed this infraction when a pledge who does not have the required "1" All-College average was recently initiated.

Privileges will be taken from the Kappas when next semester's rushing season begins December 4. The sorority will not be permitted to do any rushing until January 10.

This means, specifically, that Kappa Kappa Gamma will be denied the right to have open houses December 4 and December 18.

When a week of open rushing will be begun by other campus sororities January 3 to January 8, the Kappas will maintain a strict silent period. Then, starting with January 10 until January 13, they will be allowed to compete with other sorority women.

Kappa Kappa Gamma has been further penalized by the fact that while other sororities will be allowed two rushing parties from January 10 to January 13, they will be allowed only one.

Although Carolina was decisively outscored by mighty Georgia Tech last Saturday, the Tarheels were ahead on first downs 14 to five and Joe Bedenk, State scout, returned from the game to assure the Lion coaches and players that "Tech had a ball game that never belonged to them."

One of Tech's touchdowns came on an 80-yard run, but the other two were set up by Carolina fumbles deep in its own territory. Coach Tom Young has been drilling his backs overtime on ball handling in practice this week to erase the fumbling plague.

The Tech game unearthed two rookie Tarheel aces who will see plenty of action against State: Jack Fitch, a fast and shifty runner and pass receiver who accounted for Carolina's only score on a 32-yard reverse, and Hosea Rodgers, powerhouse fullback who made the Alabama Orange Bowl varsity as a freshman last year.

University of North Carolina authorities are preparing for a near capacity turnout for this initial meeting with Penn State in a game which they term "the biggest intersectional tilt of the year on Tarheel soil."
